

OVERVIEW OF SURVEY RESULTS & ACTION PLAN HISTORIC ENVIRONMENT SCOTLAND'S PORTAL SURVEY 2017

SUMMARY

- The key aim of the Portal is to allow stakeholders to search and view designations records and decisions, and to view applications for consent affecting scheduled monuments and associated decisions.
- 2. The information contained within the Portal is intended to be accurate. It should be straightforward to use, and ensure that Historic Environment Scotland's decision-making is transparent.
- 3. From January until the end of March 2017 Historic Environment Scotland ran a survey which invited the views of Portal users via a series of questions on Survey Monkey. 44 responses were received. Historic Environment Scotland will continue to periodically carry out surveys of Portal users, and, if necessary, make improvements in the future.
- 4. Most Portal users were satisfied with the service provided by the Portal and found the information they required easily.

INTRODUCTION

Background to the survey

The consultation on the Portal ran for a period of 3 months – from January to March 2017. It was accessible to everyone who accessed the Portal during this time period at http://portal.historicenvironment.scot/. The survey invited views on the Portal, how it was used and who was using it.

Report Objectives

The objective of this report is to provide an overview of the key results and issues raised through the survey and to set out the actions Historic Environment Scotland will take to respond to the issues raised.

Methodology

The response data were recorded, organised and summarised on a report generated by Survey Monkey. A frequency count was made of the overall number of responses by answer choices and of free text responses to certain questions. The summarised data for each question were reviewed and key themes and views were identified.

The findings of this report are specific to the survey and do not necessarily reflect the weight or range of views within the population as a whole.

Distribution and Advertising

The consultation on the Heritage Portal ran for a period of 3 months – from January to March 2017. It was accessible to all users who accessed the Portal during this time period at http://portal.historicenvironment.scot/. It was not advertised more widely as the aim was to capture the views of normal day-to-day users.

RESPONSES

Introduction

This report provides an overview of the responses to the survey where trends were observed and/or issues that were raised. It does not analyse every response in detail, as this is included in the annex to this report. The report also identifies areas where Historic Environment Scotland proposes to take action to respond to address trends, gaps in responses or issues raised.

The survey asked for responses to 13 questions about users reasons for accessing the Portal, their experience and how the Portal could be improved. Some of these questions included a section for additional comments. This was followed by five questions about the users themselves.

A total of 44 questionnaires were completed. Respondents could provide multiple answers to most questions, so the totals often add up to greater than the total number of respondents (44).

Reasons for Using the Portal

Reasons were selected from a pre-determined list. A breakdown of responses is provided in the table below.

7 of the respondents who answered "other" were accessing the portal due to general interest. Other responses including labelling photographs and work-related.

Follow-up actions

Since the introduction of the Portal, the number of designation enquiries from Solicitors for conveyancing purposes has reduced significantly. However, none of the survey respondents cited "Conveyancing" as their reason for accessing the Portal, though one respondent answered "Other/Solicitor/estate agent". As solicitors are understood to be a key user group, it is intended to approach some solicitors firms directly to find out whether the service provided by the Portal meets their needs.

The Portal provides a resource for local decision-makers, such as planning authorities as well as applicants for consent and their agents. The responses from these types of respondent, particularly applicants, was very low. It is intended to survey these stakeholders in relation to the scheduled monument consent process. Some questions about the Portal will be included as part of the scheduled monument consent stakeholder survey work.

How users search and want to search

The survey asked whether users found what they were looking for. 78.38% of respondents who answered this question (29 out of 37) answered "yes" to this question. It is recognised that it is not always possible to identify a structure from its address alone, for example because the designation record title does not always match that known to the user.

Follow-up questions asked how users preferred to search and what other services they would like to see provided through the Portal. Discounting search facilities which are already available on the Portal, users identified an interactive map search as a key method. Local authority, burgh and parish were also highlighted as potentially useful, as were images.

Follow-up actions

Whilst the search response is a positive result, it should be as high as possible. The improvement of the existing map-based search to supplement the Portal text search will help users identify the designation they are interested in.

The ability to search by parish/burgh/local authority could be investigated.

New designations normally have images attached to them. However the vast majority of designations do not benefit from this. Canmore, which is also frequently used by respondents, provides online access to images of many designated sites. In the longer term, there is potential for stronger links between the two systems.

Conclusions

Most Portal users were satisfied with the service provided by the Portal and found the information they required easily.

There are a small number of areas which could be improved in order to address concerns or suggestions made by Portal users, these are set out in the Action Plan.

There are some areas of improvement which require significant resource and are dependent on other Historic Environment Scotland projects and priorities. These relate to pulling together historic environment data, e.g. Canmore and PastMap.


































