Install historic fishing vessel 'Harvest Reaper' at north side of fort, with four support posts and an interpretation panel.

This historic fishing vessel had to be moved from the harbour because of building works. It had been situated there for 30 years and had become an icon of Burghead for artists and photographers. In order to save it for posterity, it was moved further along the harbour which was not really a suitable place as we would have been liable for harbour dues. Several locations were considered and the consensus of the Burghead Headland Trust management committee was that the position on the north shore outside the fort walls was the best option, being beside the coastal footpath and on our own land.

The level of this section of the headland was increased by around 2metres above former level This happened around 40 years ago when the sewage. discharge pipe was laid.



This photo shows present road level. The iron stumps in the foreground are the remains of the barrier which prevented the refuse cart from going over the edge when the villages rubbish was tipped into the sea. The present level was achieved by laying rock armour and filling ,on the landward side with rubble. The girders which support the Harvest Reaper's hull are 1 metre into modern rubble , and in no way in the North rampart .

The holes for the support beams measure 800mm deep, 800mm wide x800mm long

Interpretation frame – base 150mmdeep, 5000mm wide x 1000mm long
