Historic Environment Scotland has been consulted throughout the development of the main proposal. An application for scheduled monument consent was approved on behalf of Scottish Ministers in 2014. Construction of the new road (Stage 1) will commence in 2016 and Capita has been liaising with HES on discharge of conditions.

4 Summary of proposed works (max 20 words)

Infill of hollow adjacent to canal with imported material. Dual footpath to be omitted. Turning head for Scottish Canals operational vehicles relocated.

5 Description of proposed works

2 of 4 Oct 2015

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Scheduled Monument Consent was granted in 2014 for the construction of the new Tnverness West Link in Inverness. The road will cross the Caledonian Canal via a new swing bridge and detailed drawings of all works in and around the scheduled area were submitted in the application at that time.

Stage 1 of the construction of the Inverness West Link will commence in April 2016 (advance works to clear trees has taken place and this was agreed with HES on basis of the previously submitted tree plan layout). Stage 1 will involve the import of material to build up the road approach to the Canal from Canal Parks and this will iclude the approach to the bridge.

Plan PL08 (enclosed) submitted with the 2014 SMC application shows the agreed layout of road, foot and cycle paths, and the location of underpasses to separate non motorised users (NMU) from the main vehicle routes and facilitate direct access to the centre of Inverness along the River Ness from the Caledonian Canal and the Great Glen Way. A copy is attached for information. Stage 1 does not include the new swing bridge. This will be part of a furture construction works contract in Stage 2.

Drawing PL15 (enclosed) shows sections 07 and 08 through the proposed road and the Canal.

As part of a reassessment of the original design a decision has been taken to partially fill the hollow to the right of section 07 to reduce the incline and ease future maintenance as well as reduce the risk of falls.

PL15 Rev1(enclosed) shows the proposed infill circled in red. Infill will be with surplus top soil from elsewhere on the site.

I have also enclosed an additional drawing CS059146/H/100/SK064 Rev P1 to show the revised layout with the area of the infill. The boundary of the scheduled area is indicated by the dotted blue line. There is also a small change to the proposed footpath layout. The footpath closest to the canal is omitted and for safety reasons towpath users will be directed away from the swing bridge to the underpass. The path will remain as an access for Scottish Waters operational vehicles and the proposed turning circle has been reloacted closer to the new Canal crossing.

These are the only proposed changes affecting the scheduled monument as part of the Stage One. Scottish Water has now omitted the diversion of its water main through the tow path, and other services work will be undertaken in Stage 2 as part of the construction of the new swing bridge.
