5 Description of proposed works

The proposed works is to remove the trees as part of a larger salvage operation of extensive windblown areas within Rosal forest, see location map enclosed. Within the next five years we aim to clear the windblow from the site and to make windfirm edges. There are a eleven SAM's within Rosal forest listed below SM ref, title and description:

- 2513 Cnoc na h'lolaire, hut circles and clearnace cairns
- 2514 Cnon na Gamhna hut circles, burnt mounds & clearance cairns
- 2518 Allt a'Bhealaich, Hut circles

Each of these have been planted or partially planted and require sensitive clearing.

Where the archaelogical features can be identified these will be marked on site ahead of the harvesting operation. The planned works shall be managed to avoid any damage resulting from the harvesting and timber extraction operation. This marking operation will be carried out in conjuction with a consultant archaeologist. Archaeological features within scheduled monument 2513 will be largely unaffected by proposed works with only a small proportion of SAM intersecting with operational area.

Ahead of the harvesting a 'toolbox talk' shall be given to the operators by a consultant archaeologist.

All tree felling and timber extraction operations will be carefully planned to ensure that damage to identified archaeological sites is avoided and best working practice is excercied at all times. Location of extraction routes within scheduled monuments, will be ascertained with guidance from consultant archaeologist in order to safeguard historic features. The harvester will reach into hut curcles to fell any trees. Extraction routes will be brash covered and kept to a minimum, location of these routes will be sou. There will be no ground distrubance resulting from timber operations within the scheduled area. Cut timber and brash will be removed from within 10m of scheduled monument boundaries. Works shall be carried out as per the attached Method Statement.

All Scheduled sites shall be actively managed and inspected at least every 5 years, any new regrowth shall be removed.

Tilhill Forestry will seek to inform HES of the dates of any works occurring in a scheduled monument two weeks in advance.

The SM 2514 has a	number of recorded visits:					
Historic Scotland Field Officer visited the site on 29 th April 2008 and describes that "the extensive scheduled area has been sublect to several wind blow eventsThis has made the site even more diffictult to move around in and certain parts of the site are completely inaccessible".						
The site was visited on 9 th August 2012 by the Forestry Commission's archaelogist and according to the report "only seven hut circles were located and positively identified. This was due to the difficulty in accessing the scheduled sites within the standing crop of conifer treees, large areas of which had been devasted by wind-throw". Since 2012 there has been additional extensive windblow and access to the site is now severely limited.
