Chris O'Connell of Scottish Canals enquired from HES as to whether SMC would be required for this culvert replacement. HES advised that if excavations were required within the monument, SMC would be necessary.	

4 Summary of proposed works (max 20 words)

Replacement of an existing corroded culvert.

5 Description of proposed works

The invert of the existing 950mm internal diameter x 6.2m long 'Armco' galvanised steel culvert (Glen Albyn West) under the off-side unmade path at the outfall from Feeder 17 into the Caledonian Canal, is severely corroded and can no longer take tractor loading for scrub cutting along the canal. Hence, the plan is to replace the culvert with a precast concrete pipe of similar diameter and length (depending on standard pipe sizes). Furthermore, as the existing culvert was partially washed out

along the outside of the structure in December 2015, upstream training walls will be added to direct all flows into the culvert.
