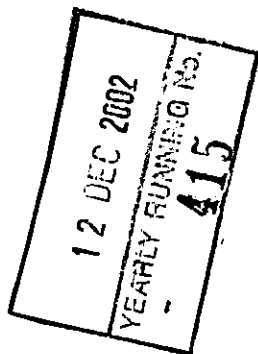

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Clachaig, chambered cairn comprises the remains of a prehistoric burial cairn, visible as an upstanding mound. The area to be scheduled is an irregular oval with maximum dimensions of 26m from WNW to ESE by 21m from NNE to SSW. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilmory and the County of Bute as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto
