THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument previously known as Loch of Yarrows, two standing stones SE and S end of, Thrumster dated 17 May and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 22 July both in the year 1939 and now to be known as Loch of Yarrows, standing stones and cairn 500m ESE of S end of loch, is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring a maximum of 70m NW-SE by 30m, to cover the remains described above and an area around and between them where evidence relating to their construction and use may be expected to survive as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.




