The monument known as Upper Latheron, broch 230m E of comprises the remains of a broch and associated structures. The area to be scheduled is oval and measures a maximum of 40m NE-SW by 60m NW-SE, to include the broch mound and surrounding remains and an area around them in which further remains may be expected to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Latheron and the County of Caithness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

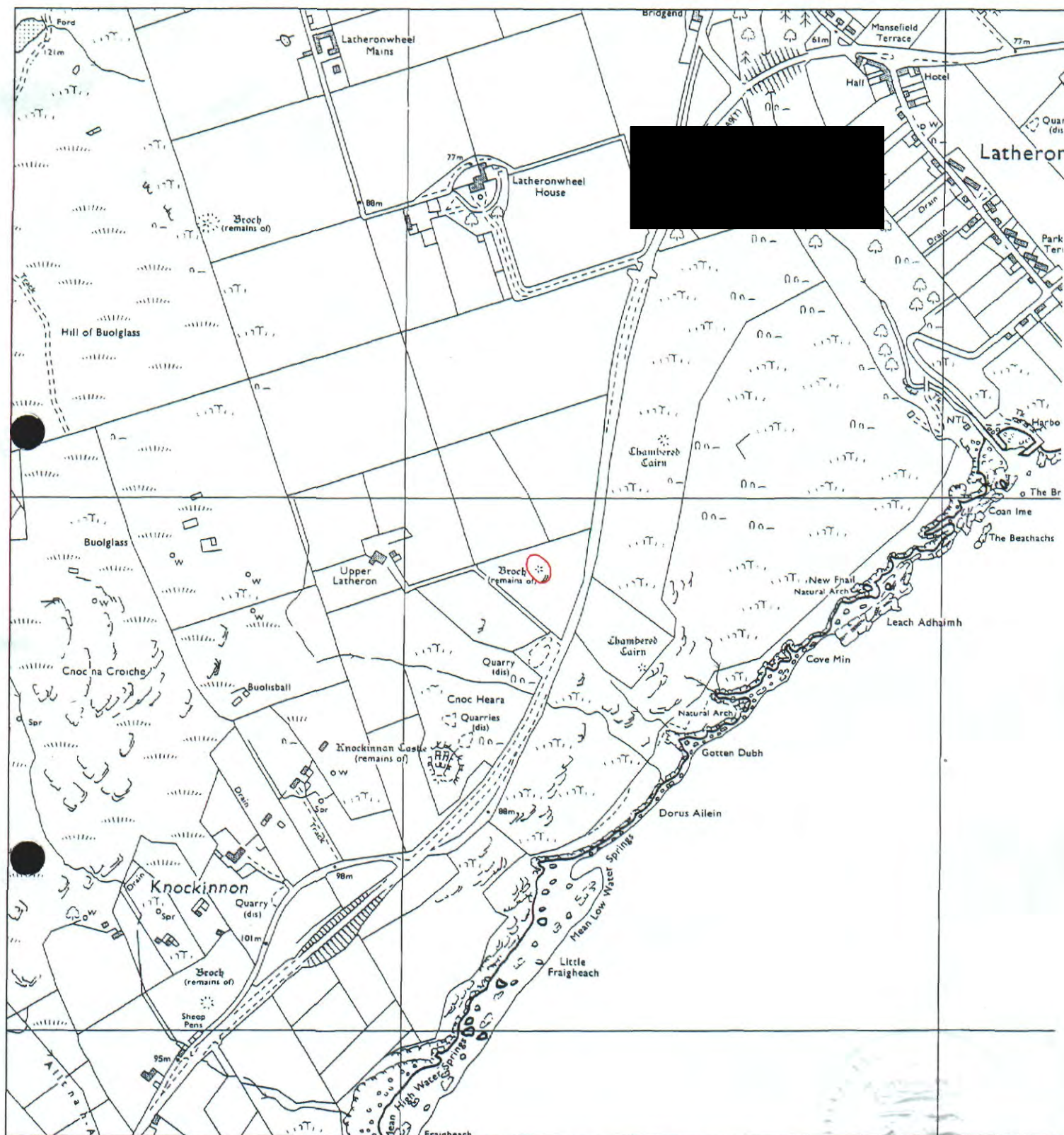
