## THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Carn Glas, chambered cairns 815m SE of Achvraid, comprises a complex long cairn formed of three linked chambered cairns, visible as a series of stone structures set into a natural saddle-shaped ridge on Essich Moor. The cairns are Neolithic, dating to the fourth millennium BC, and form part of the Orkney-Cromarty Group of chambered cairns identified by Henshall. The area to be scheduled is a clipped rectangle, to include the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. The adjacent pond is specifically excluded from the scheduling. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Inverness and Bona and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




Representation of the Scheduled Area


