The monument known as Coul Point, crannog 750m S of (formerly Carn Dubh) comprises the remains of a prehistoric crannog surviving as a mound of stones and estuarine sand on intertidal mudflat in the Beaully Firth. The area to be scheduled encompasses the crannog and an area around it in which traces of associated materials may be expected to survive. It is circular in shape and 100m in diameter. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Killearnan and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

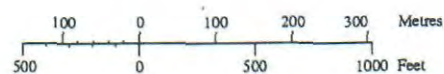
