The monument known as Belmaduthy, chambered cairn 410m SW of Belmaduthy Farm Steading consists of a Neolithic Orkney-Cromarty chambered cairn measuring about 20m in diameter. The rectangular chamber measures 5.2m from NE to SW by 1.5m transversely. The entrance passage to the SE of the chamber is flanked by a portal stone and 2 facade stones. The monument to be scheduled includes ground in which traces of activities associated with construction and use of the cairn will survive and measures 30m in diameter. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Knockbain and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative


