THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Uplands, enclosure 350m NE of comprises, on the summit of Cnoc na Laitch, the remains of a circular enclosure measuring 26.5m in diameter over a low turf covered stony bank. In the middle of the enclosure is a turf covered stony mound 3m in diameter and 0.4m high. The area to be scheduled measures 50m in diameter and includes the structures described above and an area around them in which activities associated with their use will survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kiltearn and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.






Uplands, enclosure 350m NE of
