THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Alascaig, broch comprises a broch measuring overall 17.3m in diameter with a single course of the outer face occasionally visible. The interior and all other details are obscured by tumble and vegetation. The area to be scheduled measures 50m in diameter to include the structure described above and an area around it in which features associated with its use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Edderton and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in and

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




