ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Fhamhair, fort comprises the remains of an oval fort of the Iron Age, measuring 43m N-S by 35m within a wall up to 3.5m across with outer facing stones visible for most of the perimeter. Outside the fort to the north east there is a 55m long rampart and ditch with an entrance through its centre. The area to be scheduled measures 100m in diameter to include the fort and the rampart, and an area around them in which traces of activities associated with their use may survive. The monument, with lies in the Parish of Kilmorack and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

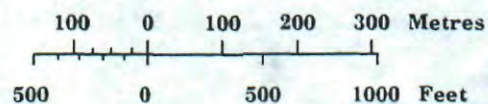
