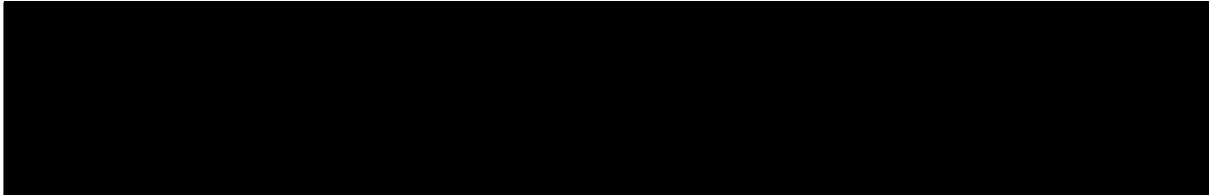

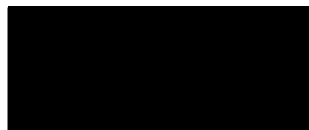
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979  
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Cnoc Eothail, Baillie na Cille, burial ground and site of chapel comprises the site of a pre-Reformation Chapel (thought to have been called St Christopher's) within a walled burial ground. The area to be scheduled is oval measuring a maximum of 33m N-S by 40m E-W to include the entire burial ground. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Uig and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms



is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

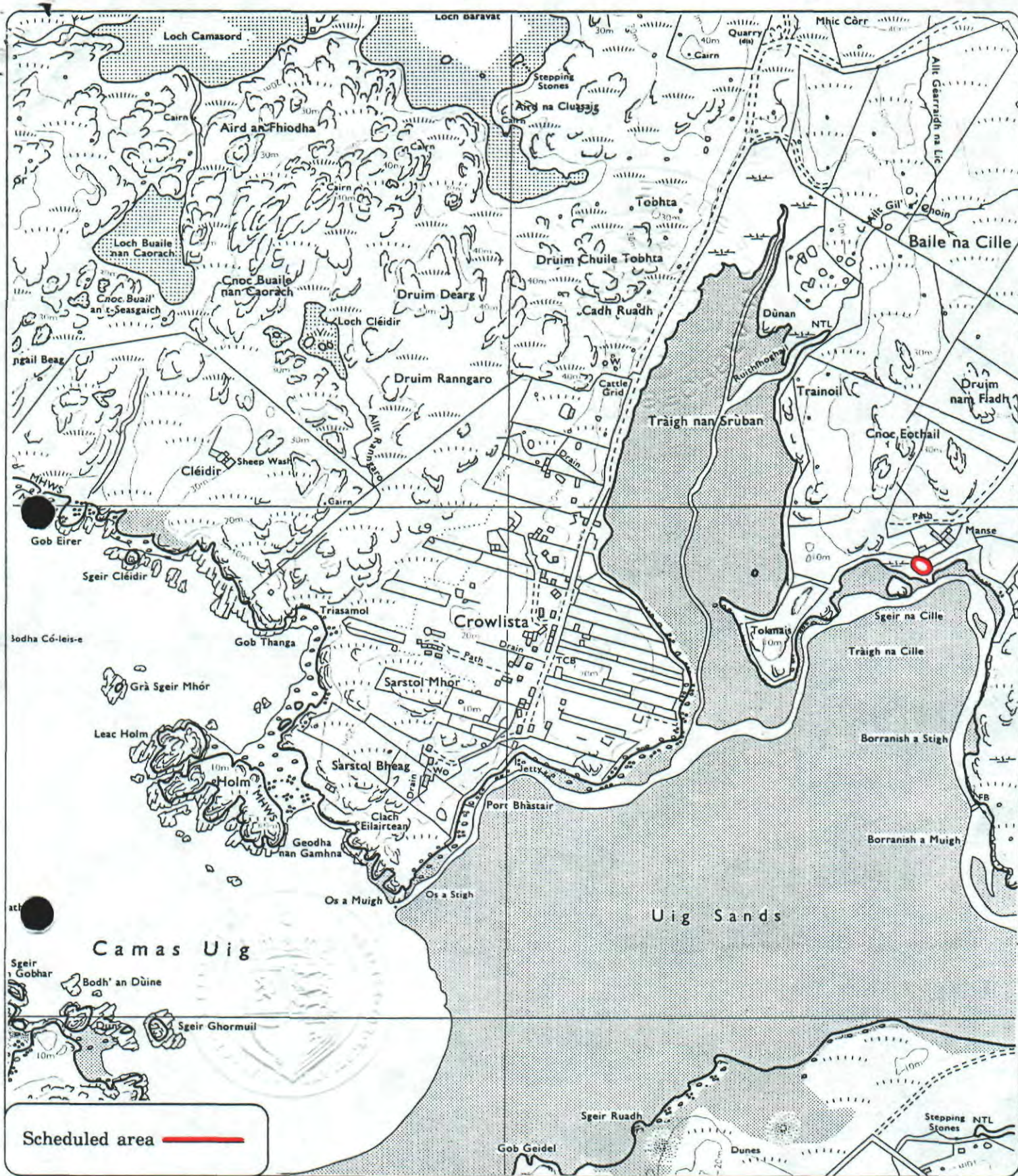

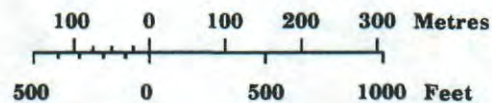
**Cnoc Eothail, Baille na Cille,
