

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Brochel Castle and chapel comprises the remains of Brochel Castle which are probably of fifteenth and sixteenth century date, and the footings of a small chapel to the NE of the castle. The area to be scheduled is irregular, measuring a maximum of 55m NNW-SSE by 50m ENE-WSW, to include the castle and chapel. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Portree (Raasay) and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




Brochel Castle and chapel
