



The monument known as Dron Chapel comprises remains of the late fifteenth/early sixteenth-century chapel of Dron which belonged to the Abbey of Coupar. The area to be scheduled is irregular, measuring a maximum of 45m E-W by 40m N-S. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Longforgan and the County of Perth as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part






