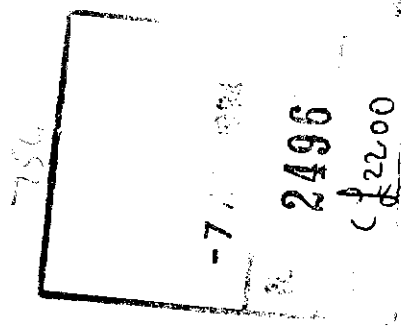

The monument known as Garrisdale, fort 500m NW of comprises a prehistoric fort located on a coastal promontory on the NW coast of Canna. The area to be scheduled measures 130m SW-NE by 115m NW-SE, to include the fort, later building and an area outwith the fort in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the fort may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles (Canna) and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the
