ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Greod, fort and kelp kiln 900m SE of comprises a prehistoric fort on top of a rock outcrop. By the NE entrance to the fort are traces of ruined later buildings, while a short distance to the N of the fort are the remains of a kelp kiln. The area to be scheduled measures 115m SSE-NNW by 70m WSW-NNE, to include the fort, the foundations of the external buildings and the kelp kiln. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles (Sanday) and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the
