

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Dun Channa, fort, Canna comprises a fort on an isolated stack of rock off the west coast of Canna. The area to be scheduled measures 60m SW-NE by 60m SE-NW, to include the fort, the access and an area around in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the fort may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.



Dun Channa, fort, Canna


