
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Rubha nic Eamoin, fort 600m S of Tarbert, Canna comprises a fort located on a coastal promontory on the S coast of Canna. The area to be scheduled measures 135m N-S by 100m E-W, to include both ramparts, the turf enclosure, the interior of the fort and an area around in which traces of activities associated with the construction and occupation of the fort may occur. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms



hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




