

The monument known as Kilmory Lodge, fort 750m WNW of comprises a fort located on a precipitous coastal promontory. The area to be scheduled measures 80m N-S by a maximum of 40m E-W, to include the fort and an area around it in which traces of activities associated with its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles (Rum) and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

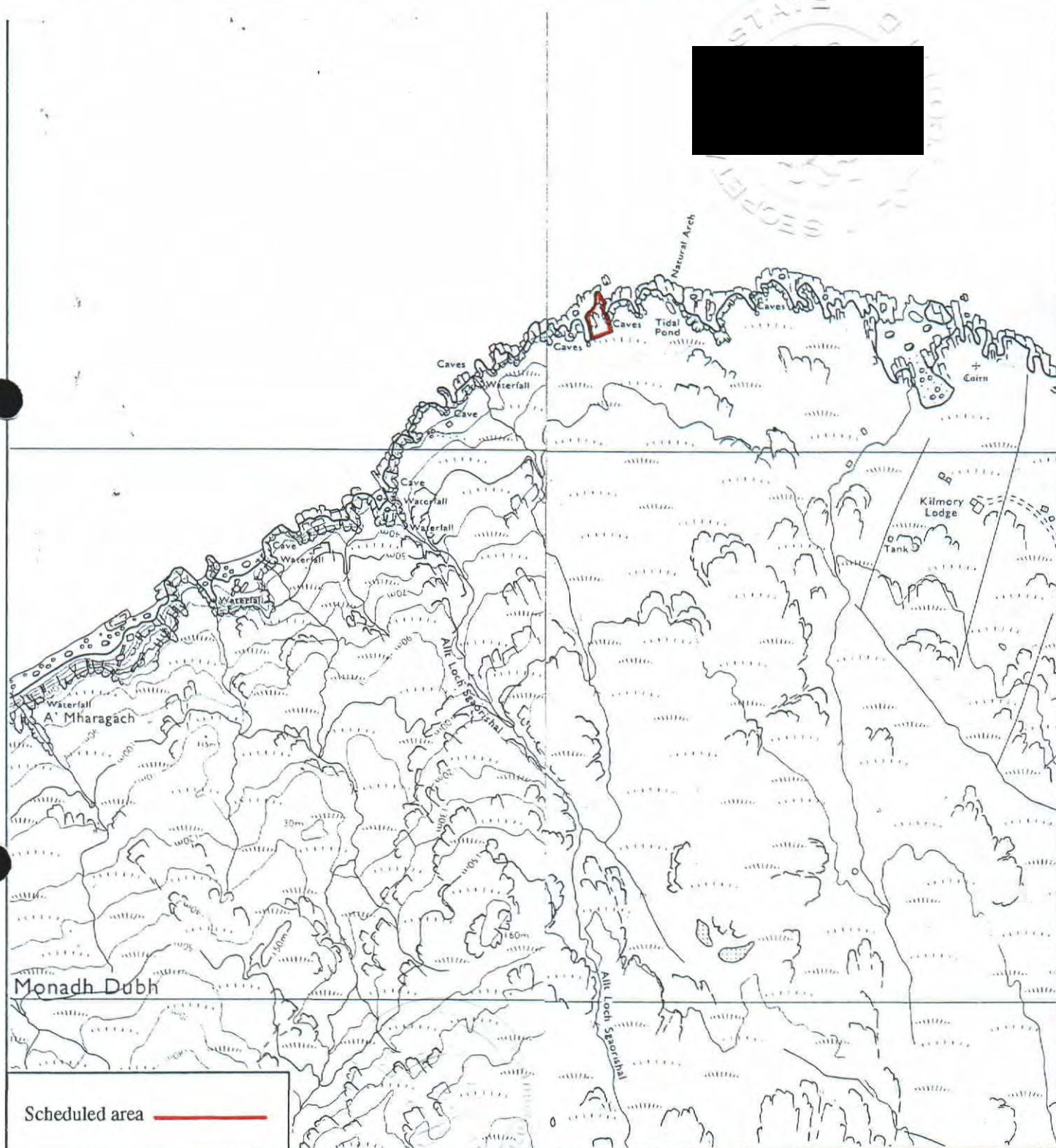

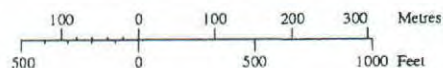
Kilmory Lodge, fort 750m WNW of
