

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Carnoch, kerb-cairn 210m ENE of comprises a kerb-cairn of pre-historic date. The monument lies in an area of rough grassland at around 10m OD. It comprises a sub-circular cairn measuring about 14m by 11m and some 0.5m in height. The area to be scheduled is circular with a diameter of 30m to include the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Ardnamurchan and the County of Argyll as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto



in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

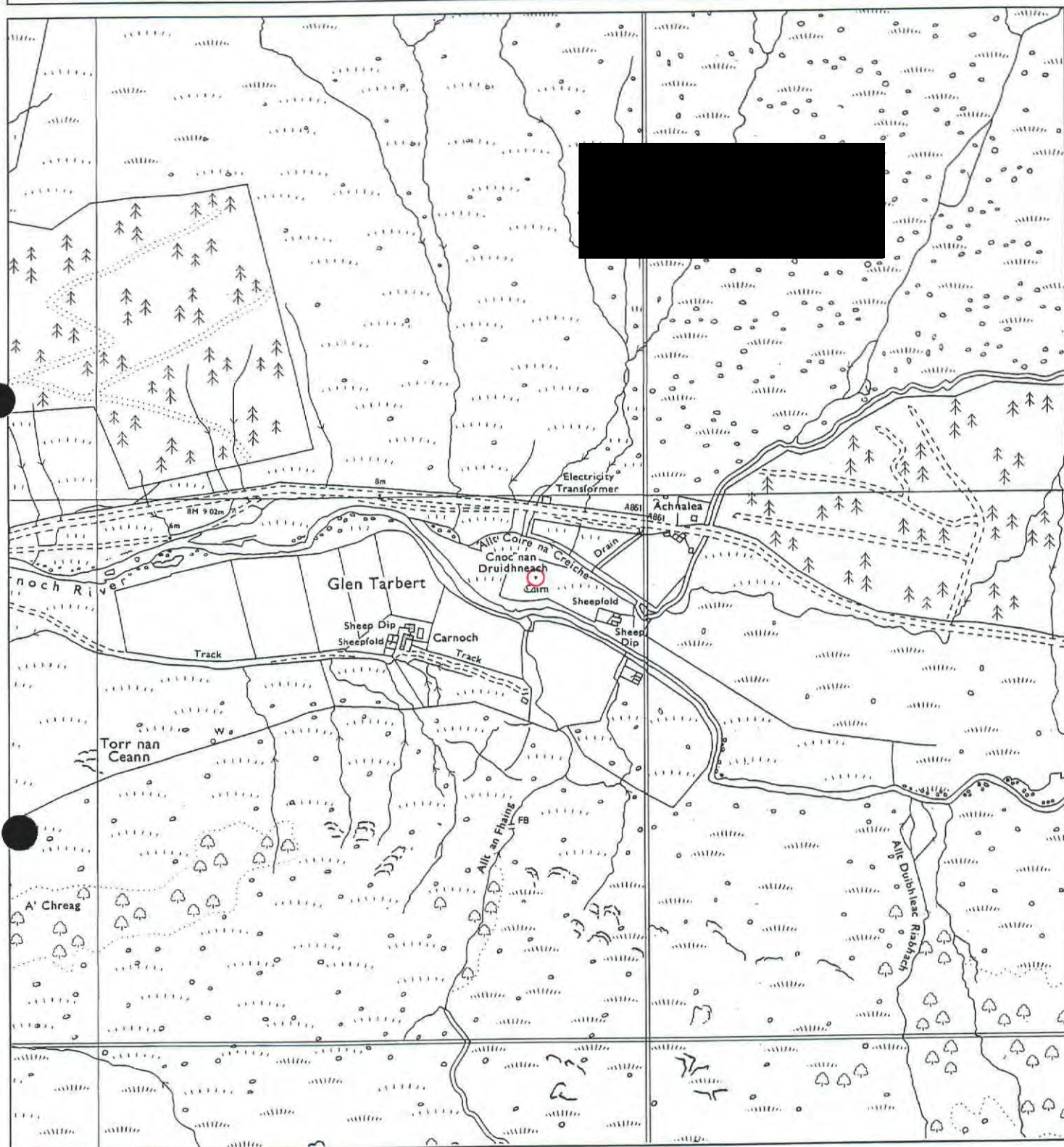
