The monument known as Phopachy, crannog 540m NNW of comprises the remains of a prehistoric crannog surviving as a low cairn on intertidal mudflats. The area to be scheduled encompasses the crannog and an area around it in which traces of associated materials may be expected to survive. It is circular in shape and 60m in diameter. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kirkhill and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

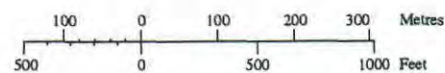


Phopachy, crannog 540m NNW of
