

## THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Orval, deer trap 700m SW of summit cairn, Rum comprises the remains of a stone built enclosure and associated linear dykes situated on a hill slope. These represent the surviving traces of a medieval deer trap. The area to be scheduled is irregular on plan and measures 250m NW to SE, by 230m SSW-NNE, to include the enclosures, linear dykes area cleared of scree, cells and an area around in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the monument may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Small Isles and the County of Inverness as shown

outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto






