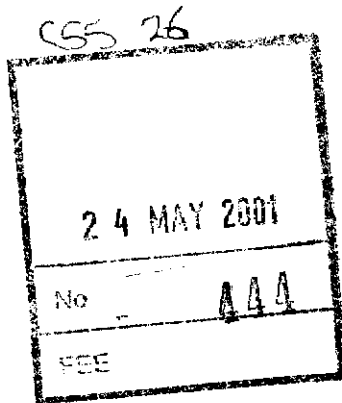

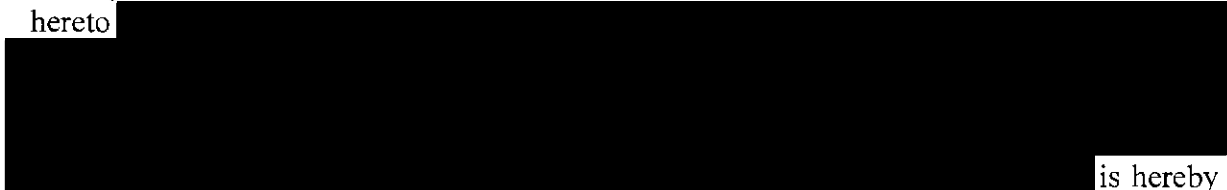

ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Kebbuck Stone, Cross Slab comprises the remains of a much-eroded early Christian carved cross slab. The area to be scheduled is a circle of 5m diameter, centred on the cross slab, to include the cross and an area around within which related material may be expected to be found. The monument, which lies in the Parish and County of Nairn as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

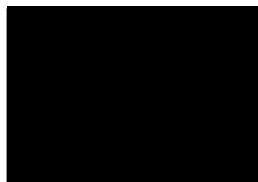

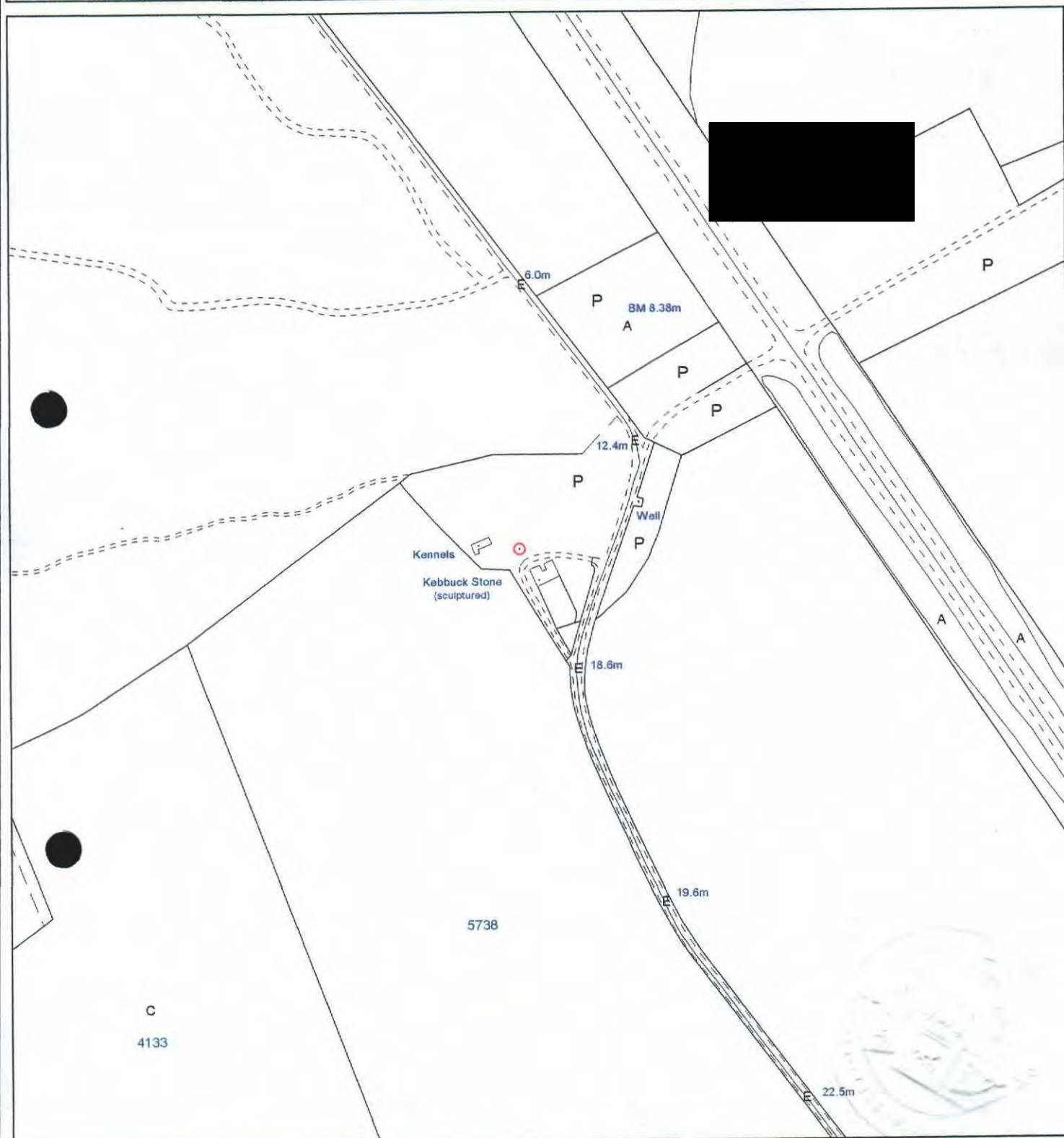
