THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Calderbank Iron Works, furnaces and associated works, comprises the remains of the iron and steel works at Calderbank, dating from the 1790s to the 1930s. The monument is situated in the partly overgrown valley to either side of the North Calder Water, to the E of the present-day village of Calderbank. It consists of the remains of mineral workings, iron and steel making furnaces, forges and mills, engines and turbines, brickworks, wagonways and railways, a railway viaduct, slag heaps, and tunnels and water management systems, visible as upstanding remains, low earthworks, and as buried archaeology. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to survive. The area is irregular, with maximum dimensions of 720m N-S by 235m W-E. The paths are included in the scheduling, although the surfaces are excluded to a depth of 300mm. The lower, stone and brick faced section of the tunnel at the S end of the site is also included in the scheduling, whereas everything above this, including the modern road, is excluded. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Old Monkland (Monklands) and the County of Lanark as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto




