

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Skail, homestead, comprises a prehistoric homestead, visible as a substantial turf-covered earthwork. The monument is situated on the NE slope of a steep valley, some 300m N of the River Naver and about 700m N of the hotel at Skail. The site sits at about 50m OD and has commanding views to the N, S and E overlooking Strath Naver. The area to be scheduled comprises the remains described and an area around them within which related material may be expected to be found. It is circular with a diameter of 60m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Farr and the County of Sutherland as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient

Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




