The monument known as Loch Achaidh na h-Inich, crannog at N end of, comprises the remains of a crannog, an island settlement of Iron Age date. It is situated 80m S of the northern shore of Loch Achaidh na h-Inich and is covered in grass and small trees. The area to be scheduled is circular measuring 35m in diameter to encompass the remains described and a surrounding area normally under the water of the loch within which evidence for the construction and use of the site would be likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Lochalsh and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

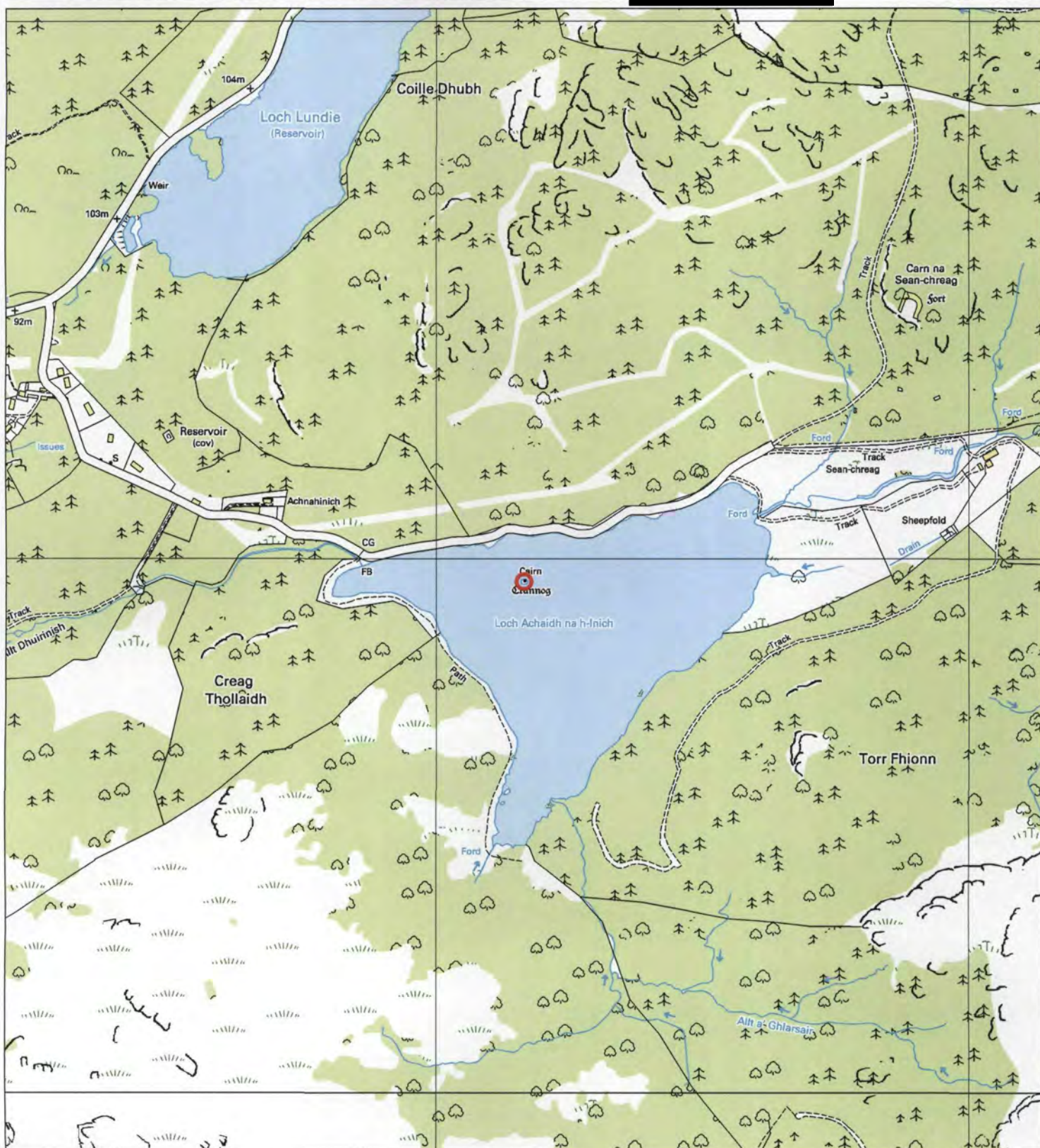
