THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Easter Lochend, fort 350m WNW of, comprises a small Iron-Age fort situated across a small ridge, lying in uncultivated pasture 350m WNW of Easter Lochend farm. The fort straddles a thin ridge running E to W, measuring 29m in diameter from N to S by 39m transversely, enclosing an internal area of 1130 square metres. The monument is defined by a bank, 0.5m high, with an outer ditch 0.5m deep and 3m wide crossing the ridge to E and W. The area to be scheduled is circular, to include the remains described and an area around in which evidence relating to the fort's construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Croy and Dalcross and the County of Nairn as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.


