The cairns occupy a gently sloping plateau above Auldearn Burn on the NW side of Laiken Glen, 5km SSE of the town of Nairn. There are approximately 50 cairns in the group, ranging in size from 5m to 11m in diameter and up to 1m in height. The area to be scheduled is irregular, to include the remains described and an area around in which evidence for their construction and use may survive, bounded on the E and SE by a drystane dyke and on the NW by a modern post-and-wire fence. The modern post-and-wire fence and drystane dyke are specifically excluded from the scheduling, to allow for their maintenance. Also excluded from the scheduling is a large pile of modern stone clearance at the centre of the field and a small modern circle of stones and trees periodically used for camping activities.
