THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Rehiran Farm House, cairn 1530m ESE of, comprises a prehistoric burial cairn, likely to date to the Early Bronze Age and surviving as a roughly circular, heather-covered stony mound. It lies in heather moorland on the W bank of the Riereach Burn, within an area of prehistoric hut circles and field systems. The cairn measures 8.5m in diameter and 0.8m high. It is edged by an almost continuous kerb of boulders, each up to 0.8m across. The interior mound of stones appears to be undisturbed and there is a slab measuring 0.5m by 0.3m visible in the surface at the centre of the cairn. The area to be scheduled is circular, centred on the cairn, to include the visible remains and an area around in which evidence relating to its construction and use may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Cawdor and the County of Nairn as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto




