THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Affleck Castle, consisting of a north/south oriented sandstone rubble built tower of mainly late 15th century date. Its parapets and gables are probably of later 16th century construction. It stands to a height of 16m, contains 4 stories and a garret and is of the L-plan type. The principal staircase fills the first 2 stories of the smaller wing; above it are chambers. The third floor chamber has fine architectural details. The small room adjoining it, in the lesser wing, was a chapel. There are no visible traces of a barmkin but the kitchen of the tower must have been situated in it. The area to be scheduled measures 14m NS by up to 13m transversely with its boundaries 1m from the walls of the tower and lies in the Parish of Monikie and the County of Angus as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto
