2. Designation Background and Development Proposals

2.1 Designation Background

25 Bridge Street, Buchan Pottery Kilns is a category B building and was listed on 04/09/1995. It is in Edinburgh Burgh.

Portobello, Harbour Road, pottery kilns is also a scheduled monument (SM3317). The current entry in the Schedule is dated 05/12/1973.

This is a nationwide project to review structures which are both listed as buildings of special architectural or historic interest and scheduled as monuments of national importance. Where appropriate the 'dual designation' of structures is being removed and they are being listed or scheduled depending on their individual circumstances. Removing dual designations will help to provide clarity for the future management of sites.

The site was not visited and the present assessment is desk-based, using available information and has included reference to recent photographs.

The asset consist of two pottery kilns, built in 1906 and 1909. They are the last two surviving large scale commercial pottery kilns in Scotland and the sole remains of the A W Buchan & Co Thistle Pottery which closed in 1972. Designation as a scheduled monument reflects the age, rarity and national importance of the structures. The kilns are a monument to Scotland's industrial past and scheduling is therefore the more appropriate designation for this asset.

3.2 Assessment against designation criteria

An assessment against the Listing criteria was not carried out as the importance of the structure will continue to be recognised through its designation as a scheduled monument.
