The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

Addition to the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 hereby adds to the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

The monument known as **Tarradale, chambered cairn 480m ENE of Hilton** comprises the remains of a chambered cairn dating from the Neolithic period, probably built between 3800 and 2500 BC. It is visible as a group of large upright slabs defining two separate chambers, both of which have two compartments. The cairn lies 40m above sea level on a hillside above the Beaully Firth.

The scheduled area is circular on plan, measuring 37m in diameter, centred on the cairn, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive

The monument, which lies in the Parish of Killearnan and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.
