Construction of an 'Access for All' shallow sloping footpath on the outer face of the Caledonian Canal embankment at Dalneigh, Inverness.
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### 5 Description of proposed works

Cut & fill to create a new 'Access-for-All' shallow sloping path on the face of the canal embankment at the west end of the existing surfaced footpath crossing the Dalneigh playing fields, Inverness – see Location Plan. The path width will be 1.5m and the path slope 1 in 12. There will be 2m long rest areas at 10m longitudinal intervals. The overall sloping path length will be approx 80m.
