4 Summary of proposed works (max 20 words)

To illuminate the path between Duddingston Road West and the Innocent tunnell improving the path for all its users.

5 Description of proposed works

The Innocent Path forms part of a well used National Cycle Network Route 1 which runs from Dover to the Shetland Islands. A section of it also forms part of a regularly used commuter route linking the east of Edinburgh and East Lothian with south central Edinburgh. The City of Edinburgh Council has recently completed a major project to link the Meadows with the Innocent Path and there are plans to continue this link westwards to the Union Canal and the NCN

Route 75.

These links form part of the Council's proposed 'Quiet Route' network that enables less confident cyclists to travel around the city.

Illuminating this section of path is seen as a way of enhancing these aspirations by reducing the perceived personal security and safety concerns.

In order to install lighting columns along this shared use path, a trench is required to be dug from Duddingston Road West to the tunnel along the south side of the path. Lighting Columns will be installed at approximately 36m centres and stand approximately 6m tall from path level. Shrubs and bushes will be removed as part of this project but it is expected that no trees will be felled.
