Retain automatic weather recording stations. Erect temporary netting to catch sheep.

5 Description of proposed works

<p>On behalf of the Soay Sheep Project I request permission to continue to monitor the weather via three automatic weather stations in Village Bay, St Kilda. The stations have been in position since 1999-2000 to measure various aspects of the weather that might affect Soay sheep. We require three stations, in Signals Meadow, at the Quarry and at St Brianan's in order to measure the variation in the weather experienced by sheep resident in different parts of the bay. Please see separate document for fuller description and location map.</p> <p>I also request permission for permission to erect temporary netting in order to catch Soay sheep during a two-week period each August. We use the netting to subdivide the catch area, prevent sheep</p>

from climbing over walls, and to create small corrals in which they are finally captured. This method has been in operation each August since 1987. The catch team consults the NTS Archaeologist prior to erection each year for an update on any delicate structures and is fully briefed before starting.
