ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Druidstone, stone circle 50m WNW of comprises a recumbent stone circle of prehistoric date, which lies on a south-east facing slope and is apparently oval in shape, measuring 13m by 30m. Two stones survive upright on the west side, and one on the east, while others, including the two stones flanking the recumbent, have fallen. The area to be scheduled is an oval measuring 35m E-W by 50m N-S centred on the centre of the circle, to include the remains of the stone circle and an area around in which traces of activities associated with the construction and use of the monument may survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Premnay and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto
