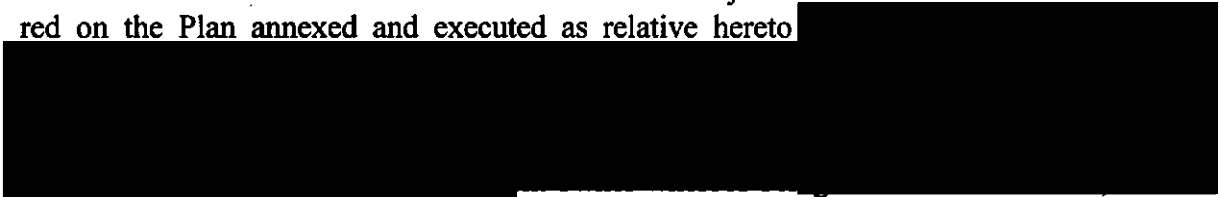

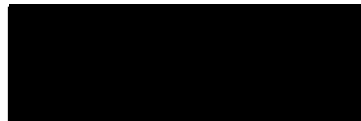
THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as North Pitglassie, stone circle 1320m SW of comprises the remains of a recumbent stone circle, of which two stones (one of them the recumbent) survive. The area to be scheduled measures 30m in diameter, to include the visible stones and an area around them in which other features are likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Auchterless and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto

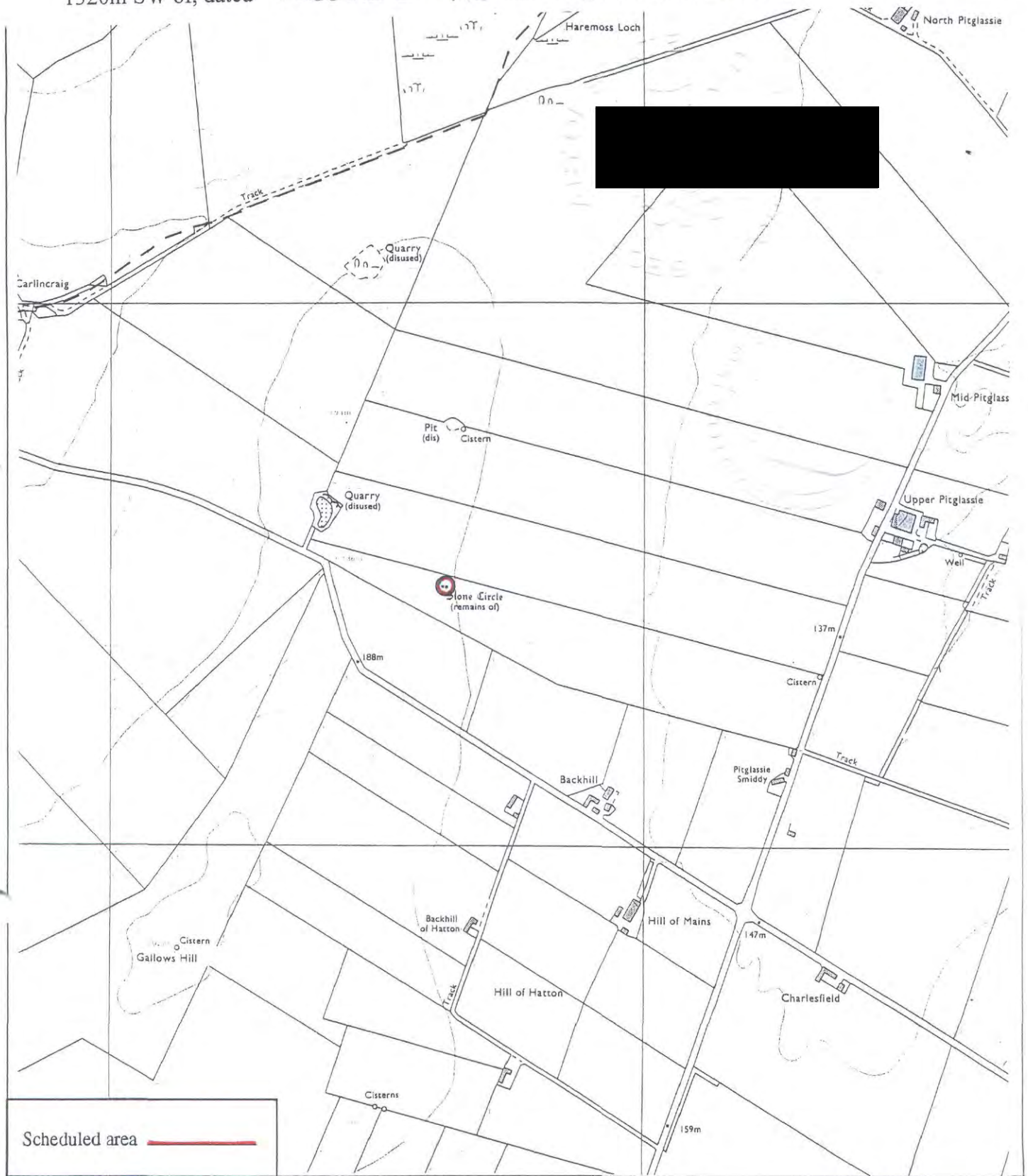
