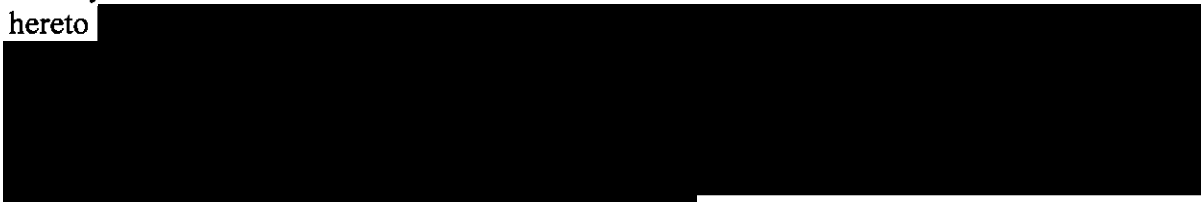

The area to be scheduled, to include the visible stones, and an area around in which other features associated with the construction and use of the circle may survive, measures 50m in diameter. 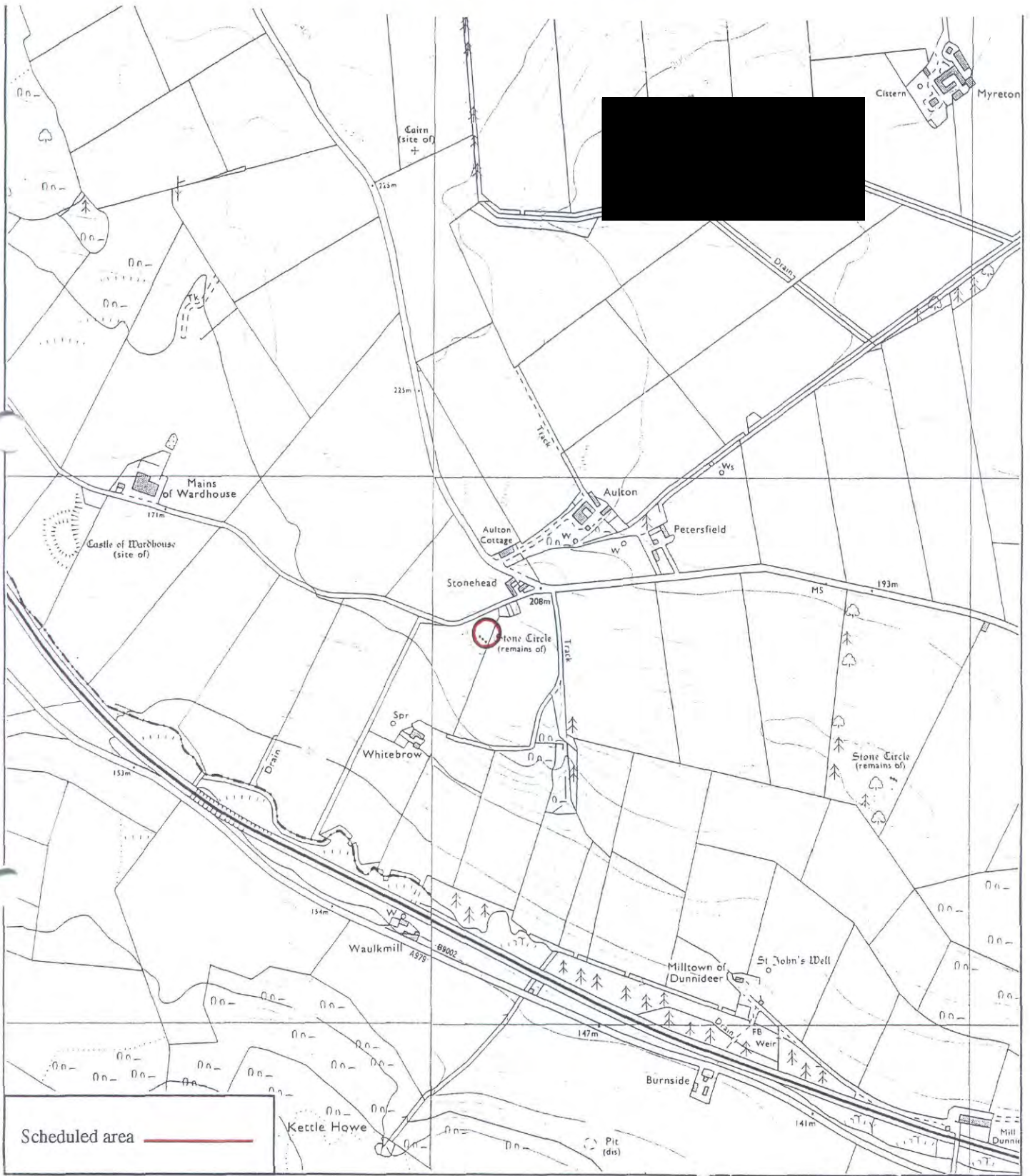
