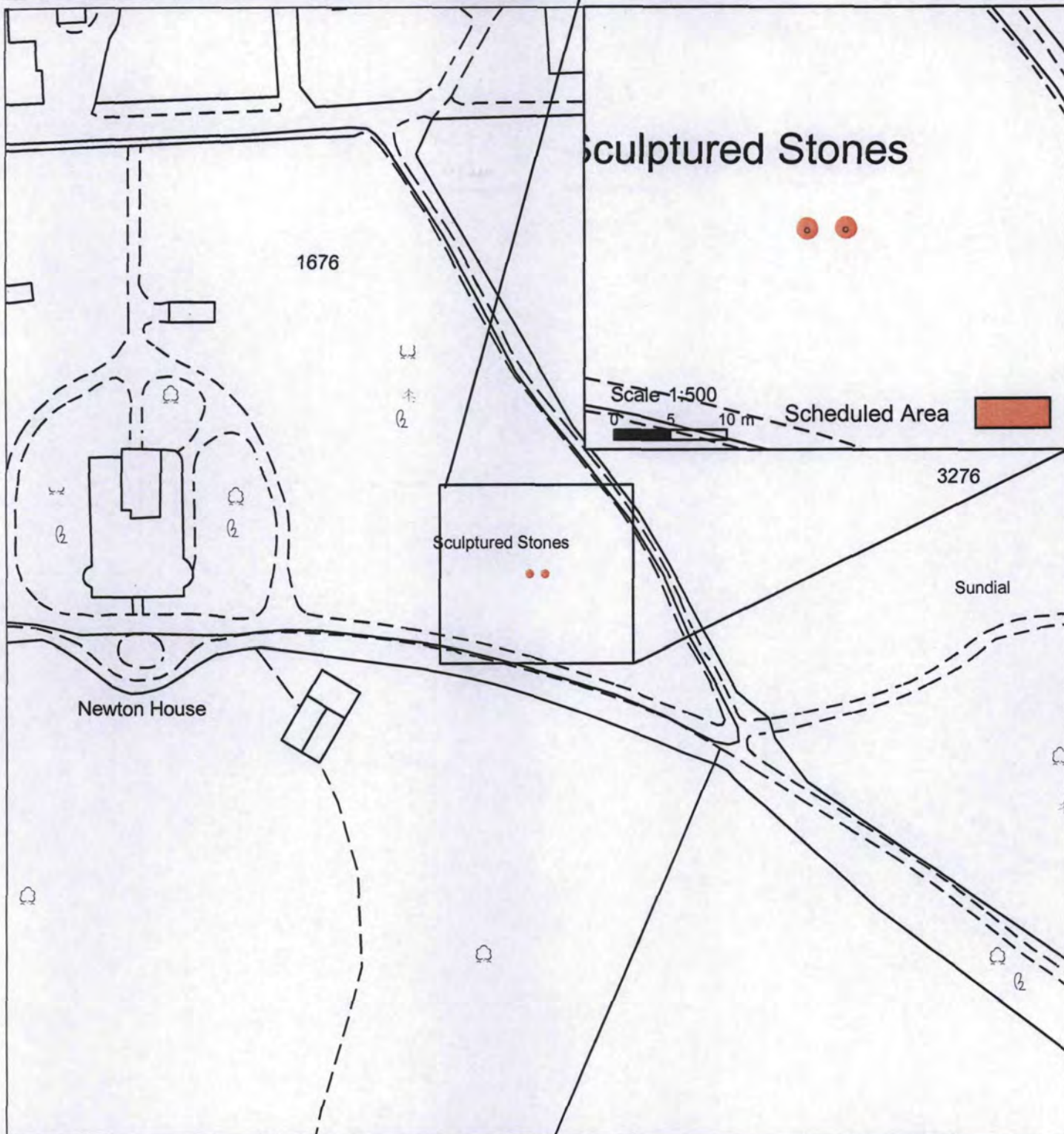

The monument known as Newton House, inscribed stone and symbol stone 90m E of, comprises two early Pictish symbol-bearing stones, both re-used prehistoric standing stones, that have been erected close to the E side of Newton House. One, known as the Newton Stone, bears two inscriptions. The area to be scheduled is a circle centred on each stone. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Culsalmond and the County of Aberdeen as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto
