

ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 ("the Act") in respect of the monument known as Three Standing Stones (two fallen) situated 320 yards north of the northmost building at Pitmudie, 300 yards north-east by north of the Glenisla-Kirriemuir road at its nearest point and 450 yards at its nearest point west of the road running north from Inzion to Braes of Coul School, notice of which entry was dated 10 September 1935 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Forfar (now Angus) on 24 October 1935, is hereby in accordance with the provisions of Section 1(5) of the Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring 20m in diameter, centred on the middle stone, all as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

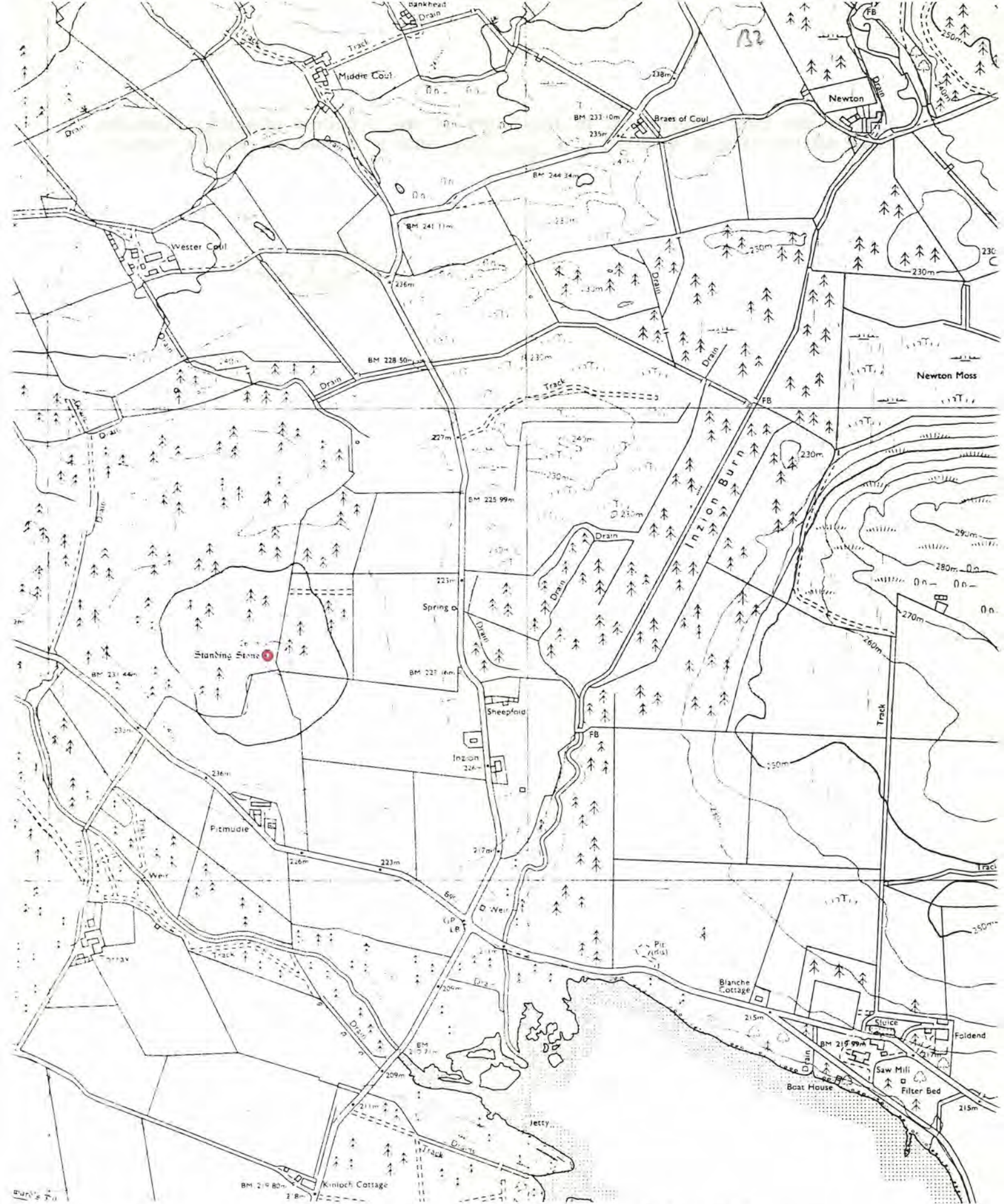

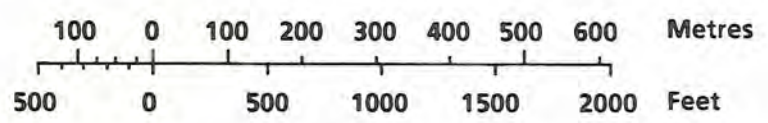

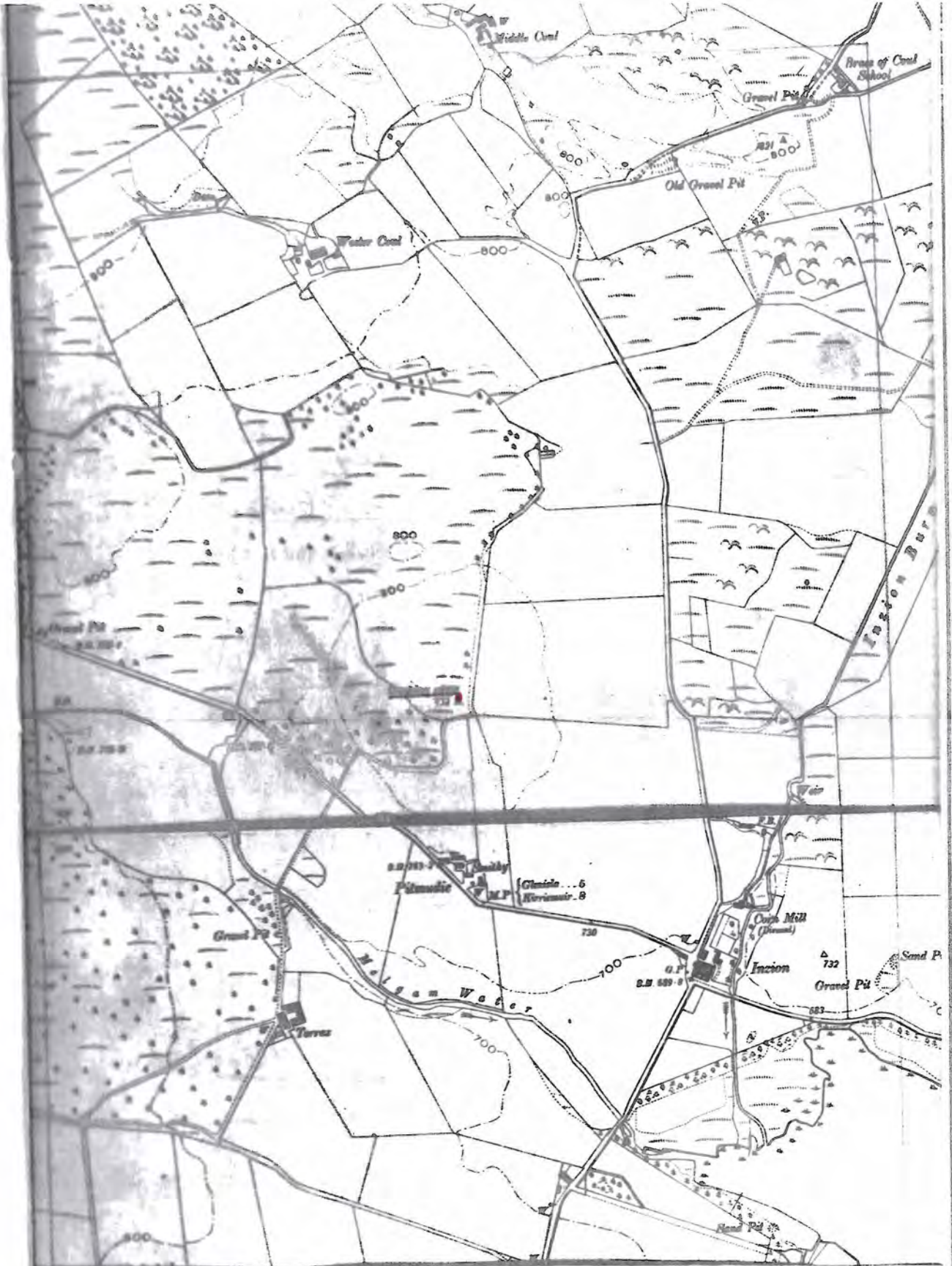
