

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 176
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as **Ballymeanoch, henge, 390m WNW of Ballmeanoch Cottage** comprises a henge: a ritual or ceremonial monument dating to the later Neolithic or early Bronze Age (the later third or early second millennium BC). It is visible as a low outer bank and shallow internal ditch enclosing a roughly circular level area, with two opposing entrances to the NNE and SSW. Overall, the henge measures about 37m in diameter. The monument is located at the southern end of Kilmartin Glen on the valley floor overlooking the Kilmartin Burn. The area to be scheduled is circular on plan, measuring 57m in diameter, centred on the monument. It includes the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment may survive. The above-ground elements of the interpretation stand are excluded from the scheduling to allow for maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilmichael Glassary and the County of Argyll as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects registered in the Land Register of Scotland under Title No ARG3916 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

This entry supersedes the Certificate of Service of Notice for the monument known then as **Ballymeanoch Bell Cairn** as referred to in the Certificate of Service of Notice by the Commissioners of HM Works and Public Buildings in respect of the monument dated 16 November 1933 and recorded in the General Register of Sasines for the County of Argyll on 20 December 1933.

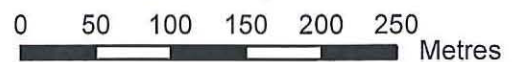
