

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Campbell of Lerags' Cross, Kilbride comprises a free-standing cross, carved from a single block of schist. The area to be scheduled is a circle 2.5m in diameter, centred on the cross, to include the cross and its modern base. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Kilmore and Kilbride and the County of Argyll as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of



Monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

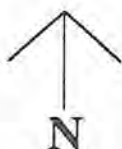

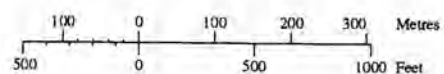
Campbell of Lerags' Cross, Kilbride
