owner of the Monument known as Tarbert Castle (in ruins) lying within an irregular area of ground on the south shore of East Loch Tarbert, bounded on the north-east by the wall or fence enclosing the gardens of houses on the south side and at the west end of Pier Road, Tarbert, along which it extends 90 yards measuring in a straight line from north-west to south-east, and measuring said area of ground from its eastmost point to its southmost point 170 yards in a south-west by south direction, from its southmost point to its south-westmost point, 50 yards in a north-west by west direction, from its south-westmost point to its westmost point 80 yards in a north by west direction, and from its westmost point to its northmost point 130 yards in a north-east direction, the northmost point of said area of ground being situated on the south-east side of said road, 170 yards north-east of The Life Boat station and 340 yards west-south-west of the boat house situated on Rudh' a Mhadaidh Bhuidhe on the north side of said road, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as Stonefield Estate situated in the Parish of Kilcalmonell and County of Argyll.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.
