AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as Seagate Castle, dated 23 February 1955 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Ayr on 5 March 1955 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring a maximum of 45m E-W by 40m N-S to include the Castle, rear courtyard, including the boundary wall which defines the area on all sides except the SE all as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

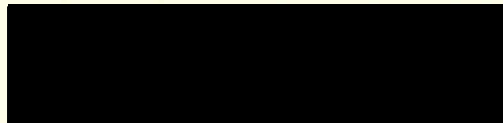

the owners of the Monument known as House in the Seagate or Seagate Castle, contained within a rectangular area of ground extending to $444\frac{1}{2}$ square yards or thereby, bounded on the south-south-west by Seagate of Irvine along which it extends 100 feet and measuring 40 feet on each of its east-south-east and west-north-west sides and 100 feet on its north-north-east side, the south-west corner of said area being situated 150 feet south-east by east of the junction of the north-east side of Seagate with the south-east side of Castle Street and 330 feet south-south-west of the junction of the north-west side of Castle Street with the south-west side of Academy Road,

being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the ~~property known as~~ subjects extending to $61\frac{1}{10}$ Poles of ground with the ruins of Seagate Castle thereon situated in the Parish of Irvine, and County of Ayr.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Minister of Works hereby give you notice that it is his intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by him under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

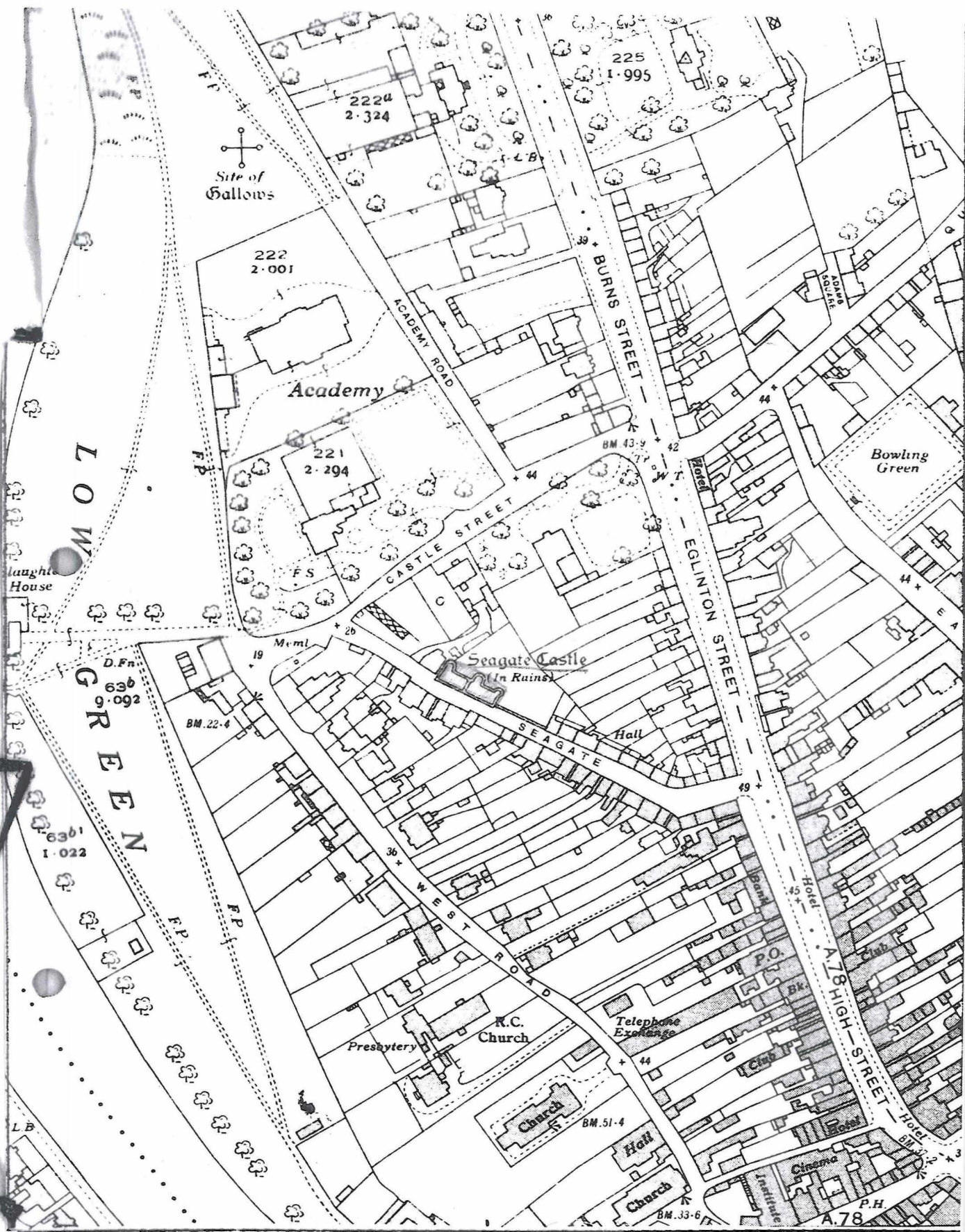
