

The monument known as Raecleugh Head Hill, fort 690m NNW of Raecleugh Head comprises a hillfort dating to later prehistory and likely to be Iron Age in origin. It is visible as three concentric, sub-circular earth and stone banks and two corresponding ditches. The fort is under improved pasture and is located on an isolated spur, at the south edge of the Lammermuirs, west of Duns 300m above sea level. The defensive works include two inner earth and stone banks between which a central ditch survives. The hillfort covers a roughly circular space 100m in diameter and its defensive works protect an inner space 66m in diameter. The area to be scheduled is circular on plan, to include the remains described and an area around within which evidence relating to their construction and use may survive. The scheduling specifically excludes the above-ground elements of a boundary fence to the S side of the monument, to allow for its maintenance. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Langton and the County of Berwick as shown in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto [REDACTED]

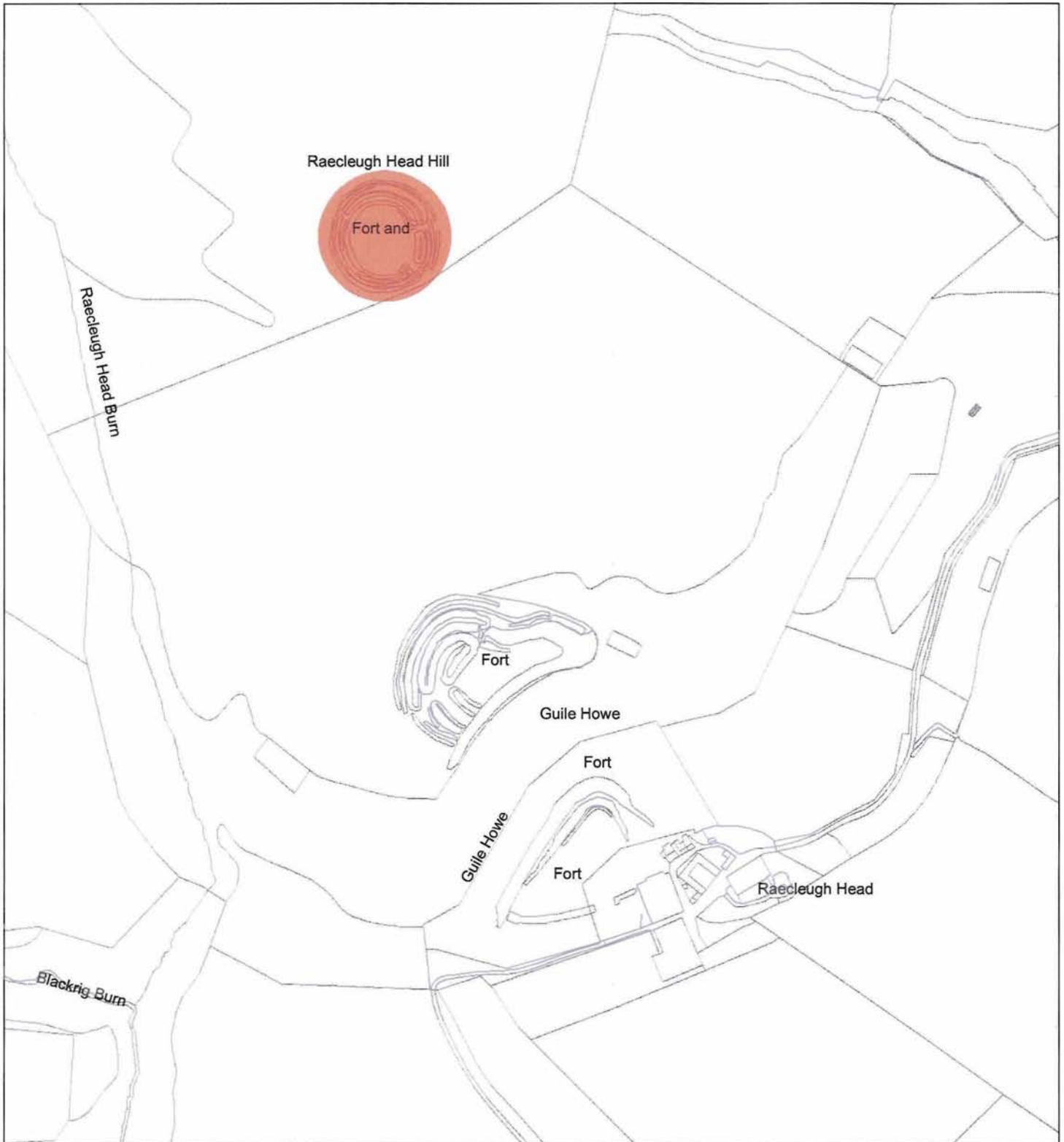
