AMENDED ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

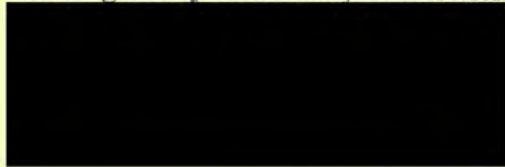
The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument known as St Helen's Church, church and hog-backed monuments, dated 17 March and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Berwick on 9 April both in the year 1936 is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring 65m from its easternmost to its westernmost points, and 65m from its northernmost to its southernmost points as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

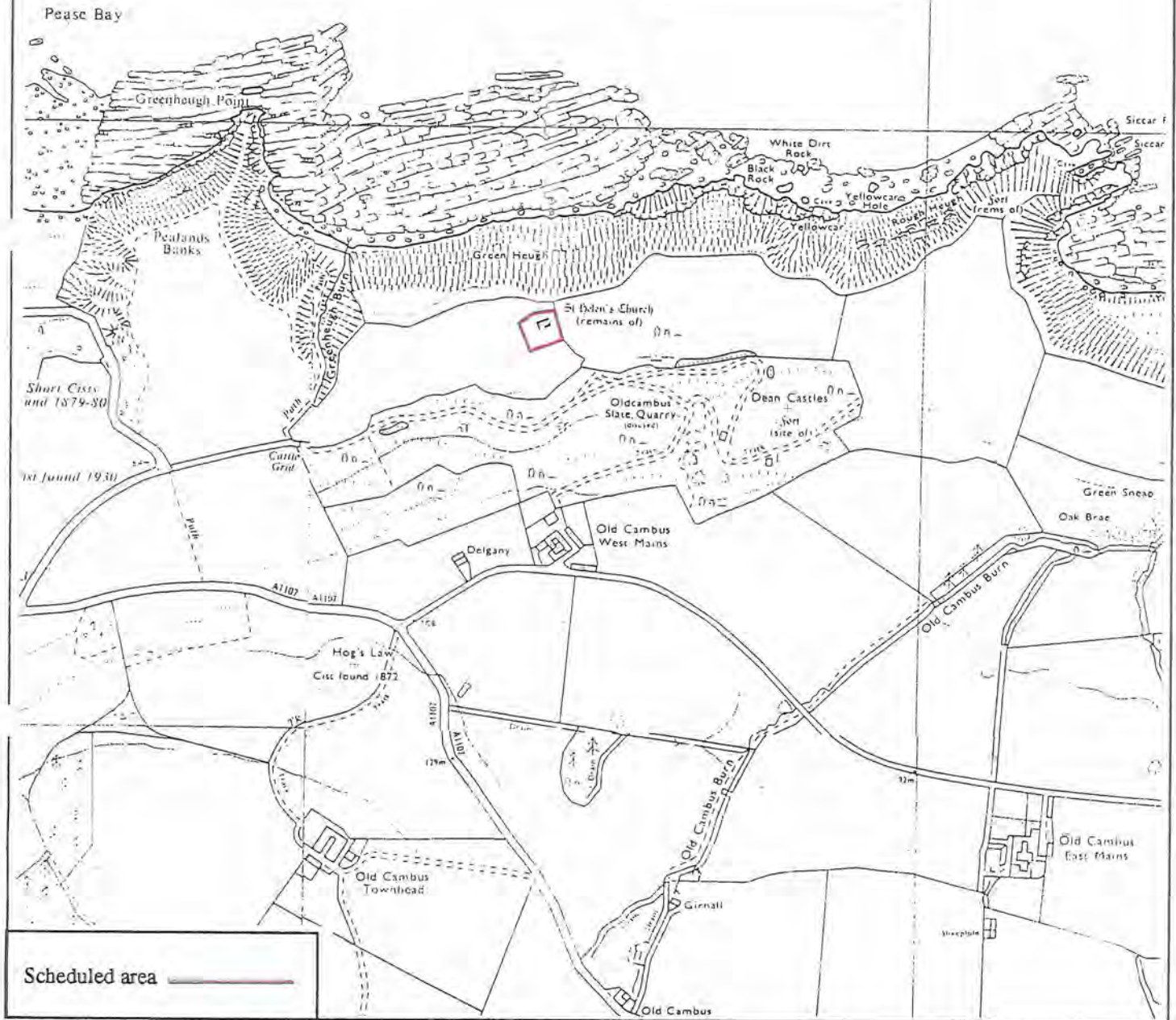

for any interest he may have as owner or otherwise of the Monuments known as Saint Helen's Kirk and Two Hog-backed Monuments in the Kirkyard there, consisting of (First) the Kirk (in ruins) situated within the Kirkyard on the Green Heugh, Cockburnspath, 180 yards south of the high water mark to the east of Pease Bay at its nearest point, 360 yards east-south-east of the Greenheugh Burn at its nearest point and 330 yards north of the northmost corner of the northmost building at Oldcambus West Mains and (Second) the two Hogbacked Monuments contained within a rectangular area of ground bounded on the north by said Kirk and on the remaining sides by other parts of said Kirkyard, and measuring 45 feet on each of its north and south sides and 24 feet on each of its east and west sides, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as the Lands and Barony of Dunglass and others situated in the Parish of Cockburnspath and County of Berwick.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monuments above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.

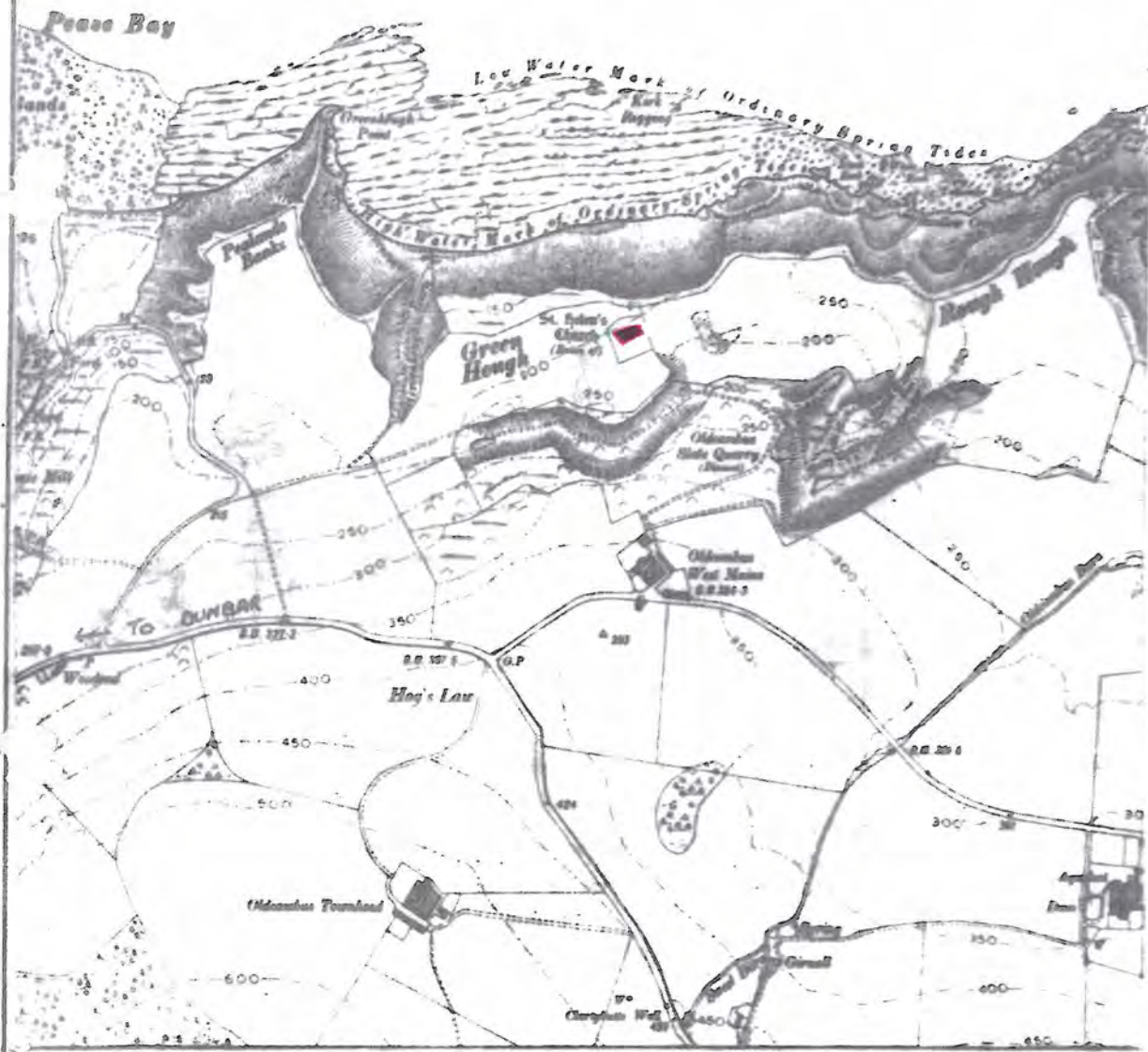
