The entry in the Schedule of monuments appearing to the Secretary of State for Scotland to be of national importance compiled and maintained by him under Section 1(1) of the above Act in respect of the monument formerly known as Achorn, homestead, dated 30 June 1939 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 31 May 1940 and now known as Achorn Bridge, prehistoric and post medieval settlement 400m ENE of, is hereby in accordance with the provisions of section 1(5) of the above Act amended to describe the area of the scheduled monument as measuring 230m WSW-ENE by a maximum of 75m NNW-SSE, to include the prehistoric and post-medieval settlements, as shown delineated in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

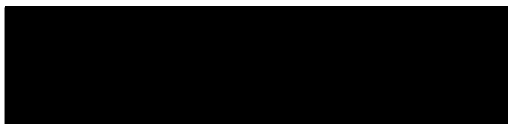

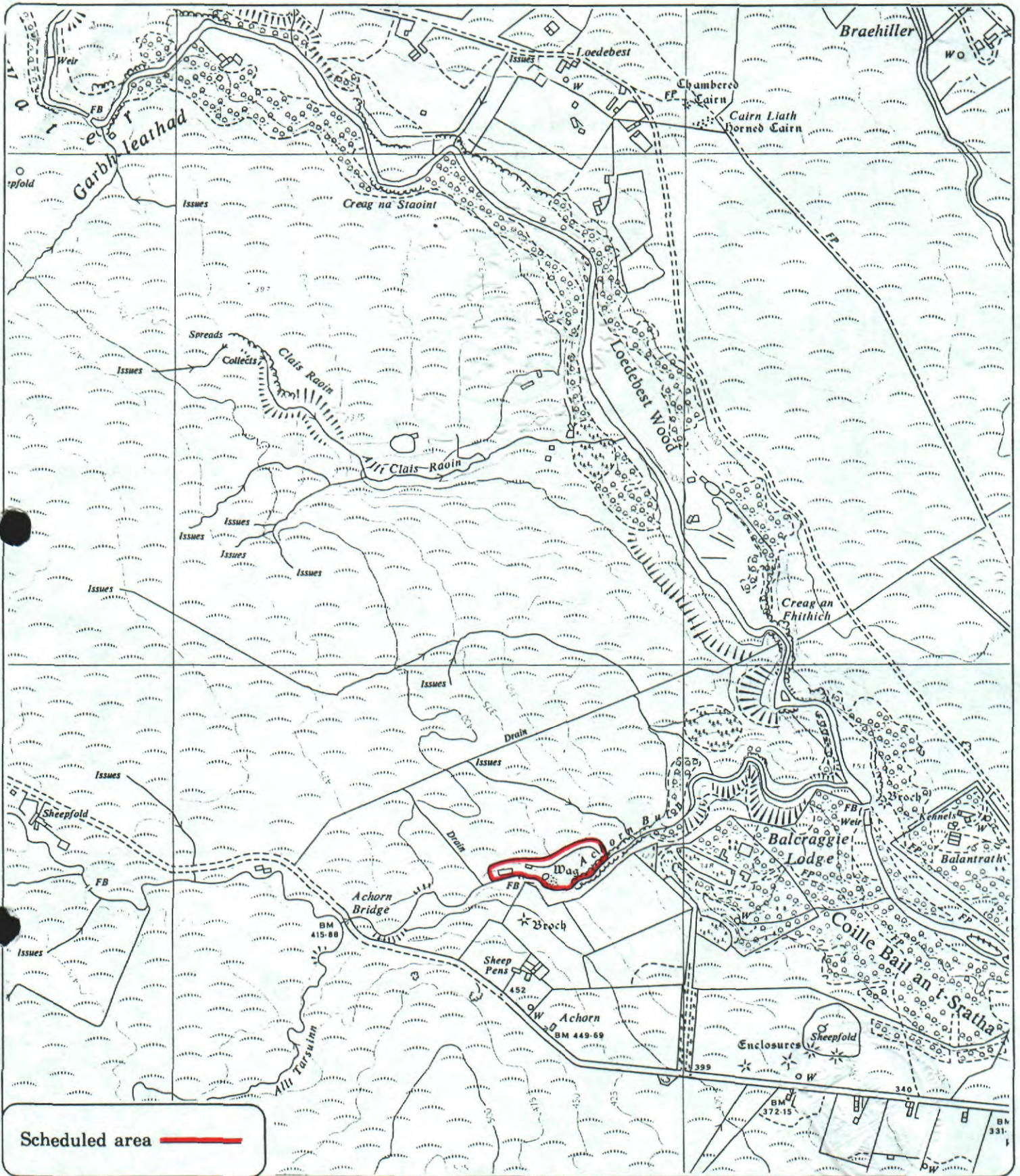

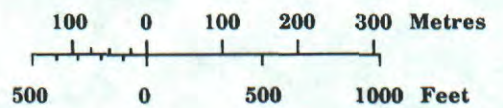
**Achorn Bridge, prehistoric and post medieval settlement
